

The CTLes: an exemple of stewardship and service leading the way in collection mutualization








Founded in 1984.

Repository to be shared by Research and Academic libraries in Paris and outskirts.

Facility owned by the French Ministry of Higher Education and Research with independent legal status.

Activities directed by a board whose members are appointed by the French Ministry of Higher Education and Research.



Ongoing operating costs are paid by the French Ministry of Higher Education and Research (nearly 700 000€ per year).

Institutions have to pay for continued storage if they do not wish to cede ownership (4,63€ per linear meter and per year – VAT included) = nearly 200 000€ per year.

ILL and DD service are a source of income (30 000 € per year - VAT included). The model agreed is that everyone has to pay even if the item requested belongs to the library that is asking for the loan.







Material stored in CTLes premises in 2011



- Property of the CTLes (36,69%)
- Sorbonne library's collections (27,13%)
- Temporary storage (2,17%)







- Titles concerned by the program: nearly 10 000
- Partners: 27 Academic and Research libraries in Paris and suburbs

In CTLes stacks:

- Serials stored: 379 (nearly 17% are complete collections)
- French serials: 12%
- Foreign serials: 88%
- Non growing serials: nearly 70% (265 titles)
- Growing serials: more than 30% (114 titles)

Shared preservation program: some features

From 2008 to 2011, only 750 issues of medicine periodicals stored at the CTLes have been delivered through the interlibrary loan service.

These issues concern only 25 titles among the 379 stored in the premises.

These loans represent 6% of the total amount of periodical delivery realised during the period 2008-2011.



80% of the loans concern foreign titles and non digitalized issues For example:

- Turkish Journal of Pediatrics
- Himiâ geterocikličeskih soedinenij

A shared preservation network: institutional background



"ABES is a publicly owned body and creates and manages information-based tools and services for the University and Research communities within the framework of French national strategy.

Among its missions, ABES is in charge of negotiating and purchasing national licences related to e-journals."



"Couperin consortium, which includes 210 institutions, is a network that unites different members: universities, research institutions and other organizations.


Among its missions it evaluates, negotiates and arranges the purchase of electronic library resources at cheapest price for its members."



"CADIST that have been created in the 80's are a network of 24 Academic libraries which aim is to govern acquisition, preservation and delivery of material on various supports and various disciplinary contents."

A tailored solution to provide e-journals and preserve printed material 2011 - 2013



Concerns more than 3,500 serials from ELSEVIER Freedom Collection.

261 of them become repository's property.

153 are re-dispatched to 8 Research and Academic libraries all over the country.
